It also celebrates 100 years of the end of World War I and the publication of *Quod Iam* Diu, the Encyclical of Pope Benedict XV "On the Future Peace Conference" that was published on 1 December, 1918. The conference will comprise of keynote addresses and workshops given by scholars from around the world involved in the work of peacebuilding. We trust that the papers and workshops will be accessible both to the academic theologians and broader community including students of theology, philosophy, law, social sciences and international relations, and those interested in the theme of religion, violence and peacebuilding more generally.
